## Update—Harry the Corgi

“Our Harry was adopted on October 5, 2012 from Rockbridge Dog Rescue. He was 3 years old. Harry is a Corgi Mix. Picture huge upright ears, a smiling face, bright intelligent eyes and a stubby tail. His tail wiggles a lot when he is happy.

He is a greeter of adults and children, just so happy to get a head pat or a tummy rub.

The vet found that he has defect in both of his hips. With medication he is able to be comfortable, take walks and do what



we call "looney loops". He runs up and down the hallway and zips around the dining table full speed for fun.

He has had to learn a lot of things such as routine, walks and learning what a toy was. With lots of love and patience he is one happy little guy. What a joy!”

## Community Service Program Updates

Between October 30, 2013 and May 31, 2014 we spayed/neutered 126 dogs, most of them free of charge! Most of these dogs also received rabies shots. We are currently waiting to hear back on several grant applications, so paws crossed that we receive more grant funding!

We have distributed over 2000 pounds of dog and cat food

through our pet food pantry project! We are still setting up our table at the Rockbridge Area Relief Association's Food Pantry once a month, and we also deliver food to families in cases of emergency.

Our humane education program has expanded, and we are now regularly visiting the



Rockbridge Regional Library and Buena Vista Public Library. During our most recent visit, we not only had stories and time with Red the Therapy Dog, but the children were given coloring sheets to work on. RDR Volunteer Coordinator Emily Cook also spoke with the children about taking good care of animals and being kind to them.

## Helping Other Rescues & Shelters

In addition to our own programs, we also provide additional help and support to the homeless dogs of Rockbridge County.

RDR offers foster support for our local shelter, providing temporary stays for dogs travelling to other rescues. These dogs, having been out of the shelter for a period of time, can go straight to their destinations without spending time in quarantine, which some areas require. We

also assist with networking homeless dogs to other rescues. By keeping dogs out of shelters, highly valuable space stays open, lives are saved, and the dogs are happier!

Other ways we assist rescues include transportation, posting transport



RDR is proud to support the efforts of a local animal welfare group called Saving Animals from Euthanasia in Rockbridge County, also known as SAFER. SAFER is working with the Lexington Police Department to assist chained dogs and their families by providing dog houses,

kennels, and fencing. This program is right in line with our philosophy of giving a helping hand to be a part of the solution!

Unchained dogs will receive any medical care needed and will be spayed/neutered if they are not already. RDR will assist in any way we can in this endeavor,


