RDR Receives 2nd Two Mauds Grant


We are truly honored to have been selected to receive a second \$10,000 spay/neuter grant from Two Mauds, Inc. Our first grant resulted in the free spay/neuter of 126 Pitties and Hounds in Rockbridge County. We also provided a rabies shot at the time of surgery. In addition, many dogs received other needed medical treatment, such as dental work and deworming.

RDR Provides Transportation Assistance



Another service we provide to the rescue community is transportation assistance to animals travelling to other states. Many dogs travel hundreds of miles to reach their new lives, and we can give these pups a lift to get them there!

- 360 local dogs have been spayed/ neutered

Critical Care Fund Started

As we expand our innovative and much-needed community assistance programs, we have started a Critical Care Fund. The purpose of this fund is to assist local families with unexpected vet bills due to catastrophic illness or injury. The first dog we assisted was a little Lab girl who was severely injured and had a leg amputated. Our

current CCF beneficiary, Maxine, is having hip joint surgery following being hit by a car. Once Maxine has recovered from surgery, we will cover her spay. RDR continues to make strides to assist the dogs in our community!
